

MINUTES OF MEETING OF CILCAIN COMMUNITY COUNCIL HELD AT THE FOOTBALL CLUB PREMISES, RHYDYMWYN ON 20 MAY 2019.

1. CHAIRMAN'S OPENING REMARKS

The Vice Chairman stood in for the Chair for the initial part of the meeting. Cllr Ramsay had been involved in a serious car accident during the weekend and she had submitted her apologies. Cllr Gareth W Hughes read out a letter tabled by Cllr Ramsay for the meeting. Cllr Ramsay indicated it had been a privilege to be the Community Council's Chairperson for the last twelve months. Cllr Ramsay thanked Members and the Clerk for the support received during the twelve month period.

The Vice Chairman welcomed Members to the Annual General meeting. The Vice Chairman also welcomed Mrs Sue Jones (Cilcain Clean and Lock) to the Meeting.

2. ELECTION OF CHAIRPERSON FOR THE ENSUING YEAR 2019/2020 (CILCAIN WARD)

It was proposed by Cllr Gareth W Hughes, seconded by Cllr J Emyr Davis, that Councillor Ian Hughes be elected to be the Chairman of the Community Council for the ensuing year. There were no other nominations. It was unanimously agreed that Cllr Ian Hughes be elected Chairman.

Upon his election, Cllr Ian Hughes signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

3. ELECTION OF VICE CHAIRPERSON FOR THE ENSUING YEAR 2019 / 2020 (RHYDYMWYN WARD)

It was proposed by Cllr Janet Butlin, seconded by Cllr John Worthington that Cllr Gareth Hughes be elected Vice Chairman. There were no other nominations seconded. It was unanimously agreed that Cllr Gareth W Hughes be elected Vice Chairman.

Upon his election, the Vice Chairman signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

4 APOLOGIES - Cllr Ann Baker, Cllr Pauline Douglas, Cllr Jean Ramsay.

5. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST - There were no Declarations of Interests.

6. TO APPOINT REPRESENTATIVES TO SERVE ON THE FOLLOWING BODIES:-

- (i) (a) Cilcain Cemetery Overseers (6) - six Cilcain Ward Members.
- (b) Rhydymwyn Cemetery Overseers (6) - six Rhydymwyn Ward Members.

- (ii) School Managers - Ysgol y Foel, Cilcain (1) - Cllr Ann Baker.
- (iii) Cilcain Village Hall Management Committee (1) - Cllr Ann Baker. Cllr Ian Hughes indicated his willingness to deputise for Cllr Ann Baker if the need arises.
- (iv) Cilcain Bowling Club Management Committee (1) - Cllr Ian Hughes. Clerk to notify Bowling Club Secretary.
- (v) (a) Trimm Rock Quarry Liaison Committee - Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported that the Quarry had recently been sold. Members recalled the letter recently received from Flintshire Minerals that the sale of the Quarry did not affect the landowners' obligation to complete the restoration of the land.

Whilst Members accepted it was unlikely there would be any future quarry liaison meetings arranged, it was agreed that one Member of the Council should be responsible for participating in any discussions between the Community Council and Flintshire Minerals. The Council will need to contact Flintshire in due course to enquire if Flintshire is making the new landowner aware of his obligations, and is seeking some form of timescale / programme for the completion of the restoration scheme.

Resolved: Cllr Mrs Janet Butlin be the Community Council's representative in any future discussion / correspondence between the Community Council and Flintshire Minerals Section.

- (b) Hendre Quarry Liaison Committee - Tarmac (1) - Cllr Gareth W Hughes and Cllr Ian Smith.
- (c) Lloyds Spar. The Clerk referred to his discussion with Mr Neil Parry from Flintshire Minerals last year. Neil had explained that it was up to the Quarry Manager if he wished to have a liaison meeting. Members noted that Lloyds was not currently an operating quarry. Cllr Thomas had reported twelve months ago that he had been in receipt of a number of complaints regarding Lloyds, and he would be arranging to have regular dialogue with the Quarry Manager. Members agreed for this arrangement to continue. Members noted there were no current complaints about the retail minerals outlet.
- (d) Cefn Mawr Quarry Pantybuarth Liaison Committee (1) - Cllr Ian Hughes. Clerk to provide Flintshire Minerals with contact details for Cllr Ian Hughes.
- (vii) Rhydymwyn Football Club Management Committee (1) - Cllr Gareth W Hughes, Cllr Jean Ramsey and Cllr Janet Butlin. Clerk to write to Mrs Burgess.
- (viii) Rhydymwyn Institute - Cllr Jean Ramsay was nominated to represent the Community Council on the Institute Committee. Clerk to inform the Institute Chairman.

Members noted the existence of five other bodies where the Community Council has Nominated / Representative / Elected / Liaison Members serving:

- (a) One Voice Wales - Wrexham / Flintshire Area Committee - Clerk explained there are four meetings per year. Two meetings per year in the Mold area (usually in Mold Town Hall) and two meeting per year in the Wrexham area. Cllr Ian Smith and Cllr Gwen Hardman nominated. Clerk to pass on the website password to Members.
- (b) AONB Committee - The recent change in AONB constitution does not now accommodate a One Voice Wales representative on the AONB Executive Committee. The Community Council receives the occasional invitation to general meetings being held (separate from the AONB Executive Committee). Cllr W Owen Thomas indicated that he attends the AONB Meetings as a County Council Representative.
- (c) Rhydymwyn Flood Sub-Committee (6 No) - Rhydymwyn Ward Members.
- (d) Rhydymwyn Nature Reserve - DEFRA now appears to be holding ad hoc meetings with the various stakeholders. The last stakeholders meetings was attended by the Clerk. Cllr W Owen Thomas and Cllr Gareth Hughes have attended meetings in the past. This arrangement to continue.
- (e) Flintshire Forum - Clerk referred to the regular meetings of the Flintshire Forum. Chair and Cllr Gwen Hardman to attend.

7. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

The Minutes of the last meeting held at the Cilcain Village Hall on 15 April 2019 were confirmed and signed by the Chairperson as being correct, subject to amendments raised by Cllr W Owen Thomas, Cllr Gareth W Hughes and Cllr Gwen Hardman.

8. MATTERS ARISING:

Highway related matters: Following a request made in the 15 April 2019 Council meeting, Members noted that Flintshire's 'action plan' is now on a separate sheet, as opposed to being attached to the correspondence pack. Since Mr Hickie was not in attendance, Members referred initially to the 15 April Minutes:

- p255 (i) Bryn Gollen - new access chamber kerb unit ordered by Flintshire. This will allow access to jet clean from both ends of split channel system.
- p255 (2) Tardd y Dwr to Fforrest Farm - Road to be surfaced this summer. Cllr Thomas reported that some temporary pot hole repairs had been done since the April Council meeting. Surfacing scheduled to take place this Summer.
- p255 (3) Winnwood gully grid raised to road channel level. Cllr Ian Smith confirmed that the gully frame had been lifted to channel level, but channel water is still passing the gully. The gully connection will probably still need looking at. Clerk to request Mr Hickie to add the gully connection to his list.
- p255 (4) Pistyll, Cilcain - Survey now completed. Provision of kerb and gully system work waiting for resources. Item to stay on Neil's action plan.

p255 (5) Nant Alyn Road near the Graig - Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported that the pot holes had been repaired. Item can now be deleted from the Minutes and Neil's' list.

p255 (6) A541 Tarmac Quarry Entrance - Cllr Janet Butlin reported that the white give way lines had been done, but they can hardly be seen, due to the amount of white dust on the road.
Repair work by a JCB to the A541 verge near the Nant Road junction has been done.

Members noted the need to repair potholes in the Quarry Road. Silt was collecting in these pot holes and limestone silt was being picked up each time wagon wheels went through a pot hole. Cllr Gareth W Hughes indicated this would be taken up with Tarmac in the Quarry liaison scheduled for the 5 June.

Members had noted in previous Council meetings that the Quarry road appeared to lack sufficient camber. If the road had adequate camber, then this water would not be standing on the exit road.

Cllr Gareth W Hughes maintained that the Quarry Management have in the past emphasised the importance of making a note of specific incidents and registration numbers. Now that a registration number has been given to the Quarry - it is hoped that this will assist the Quarry Management to sort out some of the problems.

The incident reported by Cllr W Owen Thomas of a wagon leaving the quarry which had not been through the wheel wash would be brought up at the liaison meeting.

p256 (7) Glan yr Afon, Hendre - blocked gulley cleaned out. Item can now be deleted.

p256 (8) Pedair y Groesffordd - overhanging hedge. Name and address of landowner given to Mr Hickie. Item to remain on the Council's Agenda.

p256 (9) Bryn Awelon Cilcain - Work done. Item can now be deleted.

p256 (10) Hendre culvert new fence - The fencing on the Rhydymwyn side of Coed y Felin entrance had been done. Tarmac were reluctant to repair / renew the remaining fence. The potential danger to pedestrians using the footway to be discussed further with Mr Hickie.

p257 (11) Dolfechlas Road, Rhydymwyn - Street light obstructed by overhanging hedge - Item to stay on the Agenda.

p257 (12) Donkey Field Rhydymwyn - One highway soakaway in field cleaned out. Item can now be deleted.

p257 (13) Rhydymwyn Football Club highway soakaways - Two soakaways in premises cleaned out. Item can now be deleted.

p257 (14) A541 Y Dderwen to Hendre Villas - Mr Hickie had explained in the April Council Meeting that Flintshire did not have the appropriate traffic control arrangement in place to undertake comprehensive maintenance when these gulleys were last cleaned out.

A check is also needed on the outlet into the wooded area opposite Y Dderwen. Item to stay on the Agenda.

- p257 (15) Nant Road, Hendre - potholes to be repaired between the quarry entrance and A541 junction. Item to stay on Agenda.
- p257 (16) A541 above the former Antelope Inn - Dead badger in carriageway - carcass removed within 24 hours of being reported. Item can now be deleted.
- p257 (17) Mountain Road Cilcain - blocked gulleys catch pit under carriageway to be checked out by Flintshire Streetscene. Item to remain on the Council's Agenda.
- p257 (18) Llys Alyn, Rhydymwyn - drain survey required to establish what drainage is connected to the soakaway in the school field. Item to stay on Agenda. Cllr Thomas to check if he still has access to a copy of the surface water drainage arrangement for the estate.
- p257 (19) Near school at Ffordd y Llan, Cilcain - new kerb line required to prevent vehicles churning up the verge whilst parking near the School. Cllr Thomas reported having met Mr Robin Nersaw (Save route to Schools Section). Costs being prepared to enable a funding application to be prepared for extending the footway.
- p258 **Bath Hill** (No 14 on the walkabout list) - clean edge of carriageway - Clerk to request Mr Hickie to add to his 'action plan'.
- p258 (c) **Drain blocked by Plas Wilkin.** Item had been mentioned in the April Council Meeting. Clerk to request inclusion on Mr Hickie's current 'action plan' list.
- p258 **Dual Use dog stickers** - Cllr Gwen Hardman reported that stickers had been erected in Cilcain village, but they had been cut off on two separate occasions. Cllr W Owen Thomas expressed concern regarding the increasing use being made of the Waen Field for residents exercising their dogs. The field is well used for ball games by village youngsters, so the dog fouling is not acceptable on health grounds.
Cllr W Owen Thomas volunteered to screw the signs to the entrance gate.
Cllr W Owen Thomas reported that the private enforcement firm was no longer being used by Flintshire.
- p258 **Llys Alyn Play Area** - Clerk to contact Mr Richard Roberts to check on ground levels to ensure that proposed ground profile following re-grading work is not too steep to meet Flintshire's safe slope mowing standards (20 degrees).
Other works proposed by Flintshire leisure were:
(i) Top up sand pit.
(ii) Repair boundary fence.
(iii) Investigate the unauthorised use of the litter bin.

Members authorised staining of the two wooden seats by G Bellis.

- p258 **Llys Alyn Play Area** - Tree at rear of No 47 Llys Alyn - Cllr W Owen Thomas reported that Mr Lee Shone from Flintshire had been on site to assess the possibility of removing the tree.

- p258 (e) **Culvert near Trellan Farm, Cilcain** - Flintshire Streetscene's JCB had removed debris from the culvert entrance, but will need to return when the water levels drop, so the culvert entrance condition can be assessed.
- p258 **Ffrith Lane, Loggerheads Rd, Cilcain** - Cllr John Worthington reported on work undertaken by Flintshire's JCB near Ffrith Lane. There are a couple of gulleys at the bottom of Ffrith Lane. The water from these gulleys flows under the Loggerheads Road, through Pen Lan, and discharges into a swallow hole in the corner of an adjoining field. The system had worked well for nearly fifty years. But approximately five years ago additional gulleys were introduced. The swallow hole area now has to have additional maintenance to accommodate the additional flow.
- p258 **Reporting dead badgers** - Reporting system needs to be discussed again when both Mr Hickie and Cllr John Worthington are present.

Matters arising - non highway matters

- p259 **Cilcain Notice Board** - Members had concluded in the April Council meeting, that an additional latch was needed to prevent the doors opening in strong winds. Item to stay on the Agenda.
- p259 **Pedestrian Crossing, Rhydymwyn** - Item to remain on the Agenda. Cllr W Owen Thomas reported having met Mr Lee Shone at the Hendre. Mr Shone was considering introducing a speed activated flashing sign at the Hendre. However, the sign envisaged would be the type of sign that can be shared between a few other locations in Flintshire. After being in operation in Hendre for a few weeks, the sign would be taken to the next location for a number of weeks, and eventually would return to the Hendre a few months later. Clerk requested to remind Mr shone about the two SLOW / ARAF road markings previously proposed for the Hendre.
- p259 **Ground Work, North Wales** - Item to remain on the Agenda. Lee Shone meeting to come first.
- p259 **North Wales Police, crime reports - Antelope car park** - Cllr Janet Butlin reported the vehicle left in the car park several months ago is still there. Now that the necessary Police enquiries have been made, the issue no longer needs to be considered further by the Council.
- p259 **Town and Community Council Play Scheme Programme** - Members agreed to accept the same scheme as last year. Item to stay on Agenda to ensure the 2019 scheme is well publicised.
- p 259 **Bryn Sholyn** - Cllr W Owen Thomas reported that the second static caravan may now have moved off site. Since the boundary hedge makes it difficult to obtain an accurate assessment of the position, Clerk to contact local residents to confirm the current position.

- p259 **Excavation in highway controlled land - former Post Office, Cilcain** - Item to stay on Agenda.
- p259 **Bus Service, Llys Alun, Rhydymwyn** - Cllr W Owen Thomas had reported in the April Council Meeting that Flintshire had a proposal to purchase its own buses. The Flintshire run buses could take two or three months before the system is operational. Serving the Llys Alyn area will then be considered
- Cllr Gareth W Hughes had reported to the April Council Meeting about the absence of a timetable on the Rhydymwyn bus stop. Clerk had reported the item to Flintshire's Bus Service Section.
- p260 **Coed Du Nursing Home** - Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported on the visit by Cllr Pauline Douglas and himself to the Coed Du Nursing home on the 7 May 2017. The Manager explained that the establishment does not have regular visits from the North Wales Police. Contact is made with the Police only when a patient is missing.
- This arrangement agreed with the results of the enquiries the Clerk had recently made with PCSO Connor Freel.
- The problem with the Bath House was raised, together with the Management's future intentions regarding the Main Hall.
- Cllr Hughes had been requested to submit his concerns in an E-mail following the Meeting. An E-mail had been sent, in order for the concerns to be passed on to the owner.
- The Nursing Home was not licensed by the County Council. Cllr Hughes had made a note of the identity of the Licensing Authority.
- p260 **Village Hall Car park** - Item dealt with earlier.
- p260 **Reference book by Charles Arnold Baker** - Item can now be deleted.
- p262 **Two street lamps between Rhydymwyn and Hendre** - Cllr Jean Ramsay had reported to the April Council Meeting that the lamp demolished in a road traffic accident in September / October 2018 had been replaced. A check made following the April Council Meeting confirmed that the two lamps are now lit.
- p262 **Football Club Land, Rhydymwyn** - Clerk to write to the resident who had made the complaint about the licensed land, to report there had been no response to the Council's request for the Football Club to arrange a stakeholders meeting.
- Cllr Gareth Hughes had received a complaint from a local resident regarding the music noise from an event recently held at the Football Club. Cllr Hughes had made enquiries and a music licence from Flintshire was in place for the charity event. Position noted.
- p262 **Flintshire Forum Meetings** - Dates for future Forum Meetings - 25 June 2019 and 7 October 2019. Item to stay on the Agendas until the June Council Meeting.

p264 **Style by gas compound** - Item to stay on Agenda. Clerk had spoken to Flintshire's Mr Hill to request an inspection.

p264 **Dog bin stickers / dogs on the Waen field** - Item discussed earlier.

10. **CORRESPONDENCE / COMMUNICATIONS**

Exclusion of Press and Public - In pursuant of Section 1 (2) of the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960 and having regard to the confidential nature of the business to be discussed, it may be appropriate for a number of the correspondence items below to be discussed after the press and public have been excluded.

1) 18/04 **Llys Alyn play area, Rhydymwyn** - Information from Flintshire's Play Design Officer regarding proposed maintenance work to the Llys Alyn play area. Cllr Gareth Hughes and Cllr Janet Butlin met Flintshire's Mr R Roberts on site on the 3rd May to discuss the current position. Item discussed earlier.

2) 23 /04 **Tarmac Quarry, Hendre** - Limestone dust on A541 between the Quarry exit and Rhydymwyn - Response letter from Flintshire Minerals regarding the Community Council's concern. Item discussed earlier.

3) 24/04 **Winwood, Dolfechlas Road, Rhydymwyn** - Information from Cllr Ian Smith to indicate that the recently repaired gully outside Winwood is blocked. Item discussed earlier.

- 4) 26/04 **Bryn Sholyn, Cefn Road, unauthorised development** - Position statement from Flintshire Planning regarding the unauthorised development. Item discussed earlier.
- 5) 30/04 **Visits to Town and Community Councils** - Fourth update regarding the visits by the Independent Members of Flintshire's Standards Committee. Position noted.
- 6) 30/04 **Crime reports update Feb to April** - Information from North Wales Police regarding reported crime incidences in the area. Position noted.
- 7) 01/05 **Village Hall, Cilcain** - Photographs from Cllr Gwen Hardman showing detail of surface water flooding in the Village Hall vicinity in late April. The question was raised who is responsible for cleaning out the gully pots at the bottom of the various downpipes? Cllr Gareth W Hughes indicated that the existing lease was a full repairing lease, so the Hall Committee is responsible for regular maintenance of the surface water gully pots. Cllr Gareth W Hughes recalled how Julian Hughes used to clean these gulleys out on a regular basis. Members noted that fortunately the excess surface water flowed past the Hall entrance door and into the path leading towards the toilet. The position could be improved if an eco drain (channel with a cover grill) was provided along the bottom of the stone wall to direct the water into a soakaway in the Waen Field.
- 8) 03/05 **Tree Felling, Nant Alyn Road, Rhydymwyn** - Information from the Tree Felling Contractor to detail the impending felling operations. Position noted.
- 9) 09/05 **Carriageway resurfacing Programme 2019/2020** - Information from Flintshire Streetscene regarding the inclusion of the C75 road in the surfacing programme. Position noted.

Clerk reported that the pot hole repair from Fforrest Farm to Berth Road is currently taking place. Mr Hickie had indicated that the pot hole repair between Berth Road and the Village centre would be done and surface dressed by July.

Cllr Gwen Hardman reported on the problems with the access to the refuse collection wagon being impeded by the building work taking place at the Glas Coed / Ffordd y Llan junction. Traffic lights were in place in Ffordd y Llan, but Cllr Thomas had reported that no permission had been given for the traffic lights or the scaffolding. Mr Hickie had confirmed that no applications had been received by Flintshire. Mr Hickie was currently arranging to meet the appropriate scaffolding and traffic lights contractor.

- 10) 14/05 **Tarmac Quarry, Hendre** - Update from Flintshire Minerals Section regarding the recent site monitoring to investigate the Council's concern regarding the amount of limestone dust on the A541 between the Quarry exit and the Rhosesmor junction. Item discussed earlier.

11. MATTERS RAISED SINCE THE 15 APRIL 2019 COUNCIL MEETING

- (a) **Street Lamp not working, Nant Alyn Rd, Rhydymwyn** - Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported (28 Apr) the first lamp on the RHS going up Nant Alyn Rd not working. Clerk reported lamp failure to Deeco Lighting. Deeco reminded on 13 May 2019. Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported at the Council Meeting that the lamp had now been repaired. Item can now be deleted.

- (c) **Tree Felling, Nant Alyn Road, Rhydymwyn** - Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported (2 May) seeing a Tree Felling Notice on Nant Alyn Road. Since there are a number of SSSI areas either side of Nant Alyn Road between Rhydymwyn and the Trimm Rock Quarry, enquiries were made with the Tree Felling Contractor to ensure that Natural Resources Wales had been consulted. A copy of the reply was included in the correspondence item. Item discussed earlier.
- (b) **Tarmac entrance, re-painting give way lines** - Mr Neil Hickie had reported (3 May) that the give way lines had been repainted. Item discussed earlier.
- (d) **Manhole cover A541 Rhydymwyn** - Cllr Gareth Hushes reported (13 May) surfacing disintegration around a manhole cover on the Mold side of the Rhydymwyn Service Station - Item reported to Mr N Hickie. Clerk to request Mr Hickie to add the item on to the 'action plan'.
- (e) **Institute car park entrance** - Dog bin overflowing - Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported (13 May) that the dog bin recently installed in the entrance way of the War Memorial Institute car park was overflowing. Since this dog bin was only recently installed, Mr Hickie has been requested to check if the bin has been included on Flintshire's bin emptying schedule. Cllr Gareth W Hughes had spoken to one of the dog bin collectors, who explained that the Institute bin was not on his list. Mr Hickie had explained that there were two collecting lists for Rhydymwyn.
- (f) **A541, Rhydymwyn, overhanging hedge adjoining Gas Plant frontage** - Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported (13 May) the overhanging hedge adjoining the Gas compound, obstructing the narrow pedestrian footway at this location. Item reported to Mt N Hickie. Item to go on Neil's action plan list.
- (g) **A541 Rhydymwyn, bus stop** - A section of the downpipe had been reported missing by Cllr Ian Smith in the September 2018 'walkabout meeting'. Cllr Gareth Hughes has been requested to arrange for the repair work to be undertaken by a local builder. Cllr Hughes reported at the council meeting that the repair work had been done.

Village Hall Lease - Cllr Gareth Hughes felt it would be appropriate to arrange a meeting with the Hall Ctee to discuss the lease. The Council needed the answers to a number of questions before the Council could meet the Hall Ctee. Cllr Gwen Hardman to liaise with the Clerk to request the missing information from the Council's Solicitor.

12. ANY OTHER BUSINESS -

- (a) **Rose Lane, Cilcain - pot hole repairs** - Cllr W Owen Thomas raised concerns regarding the number of pot holes in Rose Lane, Cilcain. Clerk to request Mr Hickie to add this item to his action plan list.
- (b) **Bottom Road, Cilcain - pot hole repair** - Cllr W Owen Thomas raised concerns regarding the number of pot holes in Rose Lane, Cilcain. Clerk to request Mr Hickie to add this item to his action plan list.

- (c) **Mountain Road, Cilcain** - Cllr W Owen Thomas raised the concern regarding vehicle / pedestrian conflict on the section of road. Cllr Thomas maintained that Flintshire should consider Slow/Araf marking on the road by Greystones.
 - (e) **Village Hall, Cilcain** - Cllr W Owen Thomas expressed concern regarding the condition of the concrete step between the car park and the Village Hall entrance.
 - (f) **Village Hall, Cilcain** - Cllr W Owen Thomas expressed concern regarding the condition of the concrete slabs on the pedestrian access to the Village Hall. Members felt this item should be discussed in the next Council Meeting.
 - (g) **Suspected drug use at Coed y Felin car park and Hendre mine** - A late item of correspondence from a Hendre resident was tabled at the Council Meeting. The Hendre resident had written to PCSO Connor Freel regarding three separate locations in Hendre. Clerk to contact the Hendre resident to seek further clarification regarding the locations. Cllr Greg Foster and Cllr Gareth W Hughes suggested the Clerk should also contact Connor Freel to add the Community Council's support to the complaint.
