

MINUTES OF MEETING OF CILCAIN COMMUNITY COUNCIL HELD AT THE VILLAGE HALL CILCAIN ON 18 NOVEMBER 2024.

1. CHAIRPERSON'S OPENING REMARKS

The Chairperson welcomed Members to the November Meeting. (Croeso i bawb i Gyngor Mis Tachwedd). The Chair also welcomed two local Cilcain residents (SJ and DF) to the Meeting. Flintshire County Councillor Andrew Parkhurst was also present at the Community Council Meeting.

2. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE - Cllr Ian Hughes

3. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST -

Cllr Gwen Hardman declared an interest in the Cilcain Village Hall items.

4. MINUTES OF LAST COUNCIL MEETING - Cllr Karen Parker proposed, Cllr Gwen Hardman seconded and all Members present agreed to approve the 16 Sept 2024 Minutes subject to correcting the typing errors.

5. MATTERS ARISING - HIGHWAY MATTERS:

Alterations / Additions to Action Plan:

(a) Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported that the hedge between the play area and Dolfechlas Road has been cut but not the Football Club side of the road. The hedge between the cemetery and Church Lane had not been cut. Pothole on the village side of the dip in Nant Alyn Road has been done.

Item 10 - New bench base - new base had been provided.

(b) Berth Road Junction with Ffordd y Llan - Cllr J Emyr Davies referred to the meeting members had with Richard Flood, when a new junction sign was promised. Cllr Andrew Parkhurst had recently enquired with Mr. Hickey regarding timescale. Reference was made to an email Mr Neil Hickey had recently sent to Mr Nick Williams in Flintshire Road Signs.

Item 23 - Nant Alyn Rd depression (80m village side of Coed Du Hall Junction)
Warning sign had been erected.

Item28 - Llys Alyn, Rhydymwyn - potholes repaired

Item 29 - Nant Alyn Rd, Rhydymwyn (adjoining the Graig) - potholes repaired

- (c) New pothole reported by Vista Alegre, Dolfechlas Road, Rhydymwyn
- (d) Sweeping leaves required in Cilcain Village, Trial Hill (Cilain) and Bath Hill Rhydymwyn) - Remind Neil.
- (e) Cllr Karen Parker had recently sent Neil an email to report:
 - (i) a street lamp out between Hendre and the Fron Farm entrance.
 - (ii) a bend warning sign had slipped down a supporting post on the Rhydymwyn side of Nant Road.
- (f) (iii) Longitudinal crack in carriageway due to the poor fibre optic cable trench reinstatement on the Rhydymwyn side of Nant Rd. Item first reported by Cllr Parker about twelve months ago. Item needs to go on the Action Plan.
- (g) Loggerheads Rd, Cilcain - Cllr Michael Parr expressed concern regarding the road condition on the boundary between Denbighshire CC and Flintshire CC. Either side of the boundary, the road condition was reasonable. Is there a problem in the two Councils having an understanding regarding the maintenance of the boundary itself? Clerk to ask Mr Neil Hickie for a contact in Denbighshire CC.

6. MATTERS ARISING (NON HIGHWAY MATTERS)

- p43 Solar Panels - Cllr Gwen Hardman reported that a grant funding application was being made to the National Lottery. The application cannot be completed until FCC had approved the Biodiversity Plan that the Village Hall Ctee is about to submit.
- p43 Cilcain Shop - No new information reported.
- p43 Cilcain Cemetery risk assessment - Cllr Michael Parr, in conjunction with Cllr Doyle and Cllr Hardman to modify the Cemetery Risk assessment (for volunteers working in Cilcain cemetery).
- p44 Play area - Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported that Flintshire CC's contractor had attended to the foot marks in the seeded area. Cllr Doyle enquired about the whereabouts of the key for the vehicular access gate. Cllr Hughes to check out the key position.
- p44 Street Lighting, Cilcain - Clerk reported that Deeco had been after the appropriate UMSUG Codes for the lamps provided by the AONB. Clerk had obtained the relevant codes from Gwenno Jones (AONB). Information passed on to Deeco. Clerk to pursue obtaining the 'wattage' information from DEECO.
- p44 Hendre Quarry next liaison meeting - Cllr Parker reported that the Quarry Manager had recently been away on business. No date yet available.
- p44 River Alyn, Rhydymwyn - Trees in the River Alyn opposite the Sewage Treatment Plant.

Cllr John Doyle had taken new photos showing branches starting to collect on the group of trees which had fallen across the river. Clerk to forward the information to Mr Peter Ellis at NRW.

p44 Roadside verge fenced off, Rhydymwyn - Cllr Gwen Hardman reported on the process to date:

- (i) Cllr Gwen Hardman was waiting for a response from the Land Registry
- (ii) Clerk had provided Cllr Gareth W Hughes with a plan showing the two fields where ownership details are required. If it transpires that the two fields were at one time owned by Flintshire CC, then the Community Council can ask Flintshire CC who it sold to.

p45 32 Maes Cilan, Cilcain - Cllr Andrew Parkhurst reported that the offending tree was felled on the 6 Nov 2024.

p45 Catch-pit full between the DEFRA bridge and the DEFRA grille.

Clerk reported on his discussion with Mr Michael Garrod (DEFRA) and Mr Tim Owens (NRW Hydrologist) on the 4 Nov 2024:

Mr Garrod had received approval (on 4 Nov) to instruct DEFRA's Environmental Consultant / Contractor to draw up a gravel arising management plan. The plan should take approximately six weeks to complete. The plan will identify how the gravel arising is to be dealt with.

NRW's Consent Section will then consider and hopefully approve DEFRA's plan.

p45 Cefn Road / Nant Alyn Rd, speed issues. Cllr Andrew Parkhurst reported having sent background photos to Mr Lee Shone in Flintshire CC's Traffic Section and requesting any ideas regarding the way ahead on this issue.

-- -- Speeding in Hendre - Cllr Andrew Parkhurst reported that, following one of the flood meetings in Hendre, a resident had raised the issue of vehicles speeding through the village. Cllr Parkhurst had requested Mr Shone to provide an update on the speeding problem in Hendre. The possibility of introducing a tube strip measuring device across the road needed to be re-considered. There was some uncertainty about the possibility of the 20 mph road through Hendre being included in the 'list' for re-assessing and reversing the 20 mph speed limits. Cllr Andrew Parkhurst and Cllr Karen Parker to have another look at the 'list'.

Cllr Gareth Hughes enquired when the 20 mph changes would occur? Cllr Parkhurst reported that the idea is to undertake the changes back to 30 mph gradually, possibly two at a time. On that basis, and accommodating the consultation for each change, completion will take about twelve months.

p45 Planning matters, Gwysaney Arms Hotel, Planning Application. Cllr Parkhurst reported that the Applicant and his Consultants were currently liaising with the NRW to try and agree a solution to the flooding aspects of the development.

- p45 Cilcain School Bus, new tactile pavements near the bus shelter. Cllr Andrew Parkhurst had received assurances from Flintshire CC that the gradient of the tactile slabs footway crossing was within the permitted limits for such a facility.
- p45 River Works, Rhydymwyn
- (a) Removal of the fence obstruction at the rear of the Institute. No change.
 - (b) Raising the river bank of the Fechlas Brook by a couple of feet for a 20m section near the Tarmac entrance in Nant Road. Mr James Williams (NRW) now dealing with the issue. No change.
 - (c) Obstruction in the Fechlas Brook between the Coed y Felin / A541 junction and the Tarmac entrance. No change. Clerk and Cllr Karen Parker to check if the obstruction is still in place.
- p46 Covid Snake, Playing Field, Rhydymwyn. Cllr John Doyle reported that relocating the Covid Snake display to the DEFRA site had so far received a favourable response. A site meeting had taken place. The Council now is waiting for formal approval from DEFRA.
- p46 Resurrecting the minerals grant - A response from Carolyn Thomas (A M) had been reported to the October 2024 Council Meeting. No change since last month.
- p46 Funding from Cefn Mawr Quarry - The Chairman explained that Cllr Ian Hughes had received a reply from the Quarry Manager to indicate that the Quarry was able to offer materials and labour in community schemes but no direct financial aid. The Chair maintained the information was useful to know about in the case of some community schemes. The Council was appreciative of the offer but agreed that the play scheme materials would be mainly play equipment on this occasion and therefore the offer would not match the needs.
- p46 Bus time tables. Cllr Gwen Hardman and the Clerk are currently arranging for the provision of an A3 laminated bus time table to replace the existing well-weathered time table. Cllr Hardman was consulting a Cilcain resident regarding modifications that would need to be added to the standard time table which would make the information more relevant to Cilcain residents.
- p46 Rhydymwyn Service Station - Clerk to write to the Garage owner regarding the need to consider arranging for internal traffic control measures to reduce the traffic congestion at the entrance during busy periods.
- p46 Hendre Flood Risk Management Scheme. The Chairman thanked Cllr Karen Parker for organising an excellent well attended meeting with the Hendre residents and Waterco on the 11 Nov 2024.
- (i) Cllr Karen Parker reported that of the three options put forward, the third option seemed to be the most popular option.
 - (ii) Some residents enquired whether or not small scale improvement could be undertaken prior to the main scheme being implemented. Waterco maintained the adjustments to the system in one part of the village could be detrimental to properties in another part of the village and was not usually recommended.
 - (iii) Cost benefit analysis would be undertaken prior to submitting the scheme to the Welsh Assembly.
 - (iv) Earliest timescale for implementing the scheme would be 2026/27.

- (v) Cllr Parker mentioned that overloading of the pumping station at the rear of Lloyds Terrace had recently threatened property at Lloyds Terrace. Mr Paul Reeves, Flintshire CC Land Drainage Engineer, indicated his intention to arrange a meeting with Welsh Water.
 - (vi) A lack of awareness was evident by some residents regarding the general responsibility of Riparian Owners. An information document was to be made available to residents regarding this issue.
- p46 Street Lamp, 'day burning' on A541. Cllr Gareth Hughes had reported on the 22 Sept 2024 that the repair had been carried out by Flintshire CC. Item can now be deleted.
- p46 Parking Concern Cilcain - Clerk had written to Mr Richard L Jones at Flintshire CC. Flintshire Tourism agreed to give favourable consideration to refurbish / replace the two Notice Boards at Pedair y Groesffordd.
Mr Jones had followed up the response to indicate he would first need to discuss the issue with the AONB.
Clerk to pursue an update from Mr Richard Jones.
- p36 Drainage, Nant Road, Rhydymwyn - The culvert outfall had been identified as being partly blocked in a river walk that Cllr Gareth W Hughes and the Clerk had attended on 15 Nov 2023. A check in Nov/ Dec 2024 will be required when the vegetation has died down.
- p47 Sycamore Tree at Sharphaw, Dolfechlas Road, Rhydymwyn - a request for an update on the tree position had been received from Mr Paul Rushworth on the 18 Oct 2024. The request for the update was passed on to Flintshire Housing on the 20 Oct 2024. No response had been received from Flintshire CC since 20 Oct.
Cllr Andrew Parkhurst indicated that he would assist if no positive response is forthcoming in the next few months.
- p48 Brithdir Mawr and Garth Lane Reservoirs
- (i) Cllr Parkhurst and Cllr Worthington had met Gwenan Davies (Dwr Cymru) and interested residents at Brithdir Mawr and at the Pentre. Chair thanked Cllr Parkhurst for organising the meeting.
 - (ii) Cllr Parkhurst referred to a previous meeting which had occurred on site at Brithdir Mawr. All the concerns raised at that meeting had only been responded to at 5.00pm on the Friday, with the work on site scheduled to start on the following Monday. Dwr Cymru apologised.
 - (iii) Mr Neil Hickie to arrange a 'before and after' survey of the access road to assess the extent of any damage.
 - (iv) Dwr Cymru will consider possible means of reducing the speed of the watercourse after the reservoir has been removed. One option to be considered is to widen the stream to bring about a reduction in the flow velocity.
 - (v) There was concern raised regarding the aquifer level adversely affecting adjoining properties. The landowners who were relying on boreholes for providing water supply were concerned that they may lose the water supply when the aquifer is lowered. It was decided to measure water levels in the boreholes as the reservoir water level fell.
 - (vi) Dwr Cymru maintained the work was not subject to planning permission. However, Dwr Cymru had undertaken consultation with NRW.
 - (vii) Cllr Tim Mitchell said he would be very surprised if Dwr Cymru were legally responsible for any consequences arising from reducing the aquifer level.

Cllr Parkhurst indicated that Gwenan Davies was going to check the legal position with DWR Cymru's Legal Section.

- (viii) At the Pentre meeting, the Chairman reported that the main concern was that the amount of flow and speed of the flow in the watercourse was now much faster than when the reservoirs were in place. The loss of attenuation following the removal of the reservoirs had been mentioned in the October Council Meeting.
- (ix) Cllr Gwen Hardman felt if legal responsibility is being questioned, then the position should also be checked by the County Council's Legal Section. The Chair felt the Council should first wait to see what Dwr Cymru comes back with.
- (x) Cllr John Doyle maintained that Dwr Cymru should have prepared an 'Impact Assessment' study that would identify all the consequences of removing the reservoirs.
- (xi) The Clerk maintained that Dwr Cymru's 'internal' impact assessment should be checked and assessed externally, either by NRW or by Flintshire CC's Land Drainage Engineer.

p49 Highway footway opposite former Antelope Rhydymwyn - Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported the trees overhanging the footway forcing pedestrians to step onto the carriageway at this section of footway. Clerk reported having spoken to Mr Hickie. Some cutting back of the hedge had taken place. Cllr Hughes maintained the issue had not gone away. Clerk to pursue further with Mr Neil Hickie.

p49 Septic Tank serving Ruby Houses, Rhydymwyn. Flintshire CC Cllr Andrew Parkhurst reported that a meeting had been arranged at Ty Dewi Sant for the residents to discuss the situation with the appropriate Flintshire CC Officer. The concern regarding the land in front of Ruby Houses having been filled some time ago without planning permission had been referred to Flintshire's Enforcement Section.

p50 Cilcain Defibrillator - The Chair invited Mrs Sue Jones to update the Council on the defibrillator. Mrs Jones reported:

- (i) The defibrillator was now working.
- (ii) Attempts had been made to contact the Nannerch Chairman about the paperwork regarding connection into the system.
- (iii) Signs had been noticed in Nannerch to assist in locating the defibrillator. Enquiries to be made to establish where the Nannerch signs were sourced from.

p50 Proposal for a new National Park - Chair reported:

- (i) A meeting had been arranged for the farming community at Llysfasi on Wednesday 20 Nov 2024.
- (ii) It did not appear that the Community Council was being invited to submit its observations but there was no reason why Members could not submit their individual views.
- (iii) Cllr J Emyr Davies had requested that the Council asks NRW the question - what would be the advantages of a National Park for locals residents.

7. PLANNING MATTERS -

- (a) Ref No: LBC/000864/24

Proposal: Listed building application for renovations & alterations to existing farmhouse
Location: Pen Y Cefn Farm, Rhydymwyn, Mold, CH7 5HP

The Community Council has **no objection** to the application.

(b) Pre-application consultation - Antelope Industrial Estate, Rhydymwyn -

The notice and details had been emailed to all Council Members on the 18 Nov 2024.

Members agreed that units proposed on an existing industrial estate were of the usual industrial type design. Therefore, the development was unlikely to have an adverse effect on Rhydymwyn village residents.

Members noted that in the past, the only concern which had been expressed by adjoining residents was the noise produced by a glass recycling unit.

Members observed that the main sewer from the village probably crosses the site and should be noted.

Since the application response deadline was on the 16 Dec 2024, Members agreed that Cllr Andrew Parkhurst should request an extension of the deadline to the 23 Dec 2024.

(c) Unit No 1, Antelope Industrial estate - Members noted that a new shed had recently been erected behind Unit No 1. The Council was not aware of planning permission being given Clerk to report to Flintshire; Enforcement Officer

8. CORRESPONDENCE

- 1) 23/10 Playground Inspections and Maintenance. Copy of correspondence between Cllr Andrew Parkhurst and Flintshire CC regarding the above. Flintshire CC had responded to indicate that the service transfer scheduled for 31 Oct 2024 from Aura to the Flintshire Local Authority Trading Company would not change the inspection regime.
- 2) 24/10 Gritter in Cilcain. Report from Cllr Ian Hughes that Flintshire CC's gritter was in Cilcain village when there was no frost forecasted. Enquiries made with Mr Hickie. It appears that a new gritter had been acquired by Flintshire Streetscene and operators were having their annual 'dry run' prior to the start of the gritting season. Position noted.
- 3) 27/10 Water Course, Pentre, Cilcain. Copy of email Cllr Parkhurst sent to Dwr Cymru (Sian Pritchard) regarding drainage concern. Item dealt with earlier.
- 4) 29/10 Cilcain YFC Bonfire, Tuesday 5 Nov 2024. Email to YFC Chair (Mali Jones) detailing the arrangements for road cones in Ffordd y Llan and The Square.

The issues discussed were:

- (i) The Chair reported that there had been a parking concern received from one Cilcain resident. The resident lived in Parc Is y Mynydd, so was well outside the areas where road cones are normally used for controlling parking.
- (ii) There was a shortage of cones this year. 30 cones had been ordered but only 10 supplied by Flintshire.
- (iii) Cllr Christine Vaughan maintained that the problems are often due to inconsiderate parking regardless of road cones being in place.
- (iv) Cllr Gwen Hardman maintained that parking in fields at night in the Winter is not practical.
- (v) Cllr Vaughan suggested that the Cilcain YFC be requested to include a plea for considerate parking in their event advertising next year.
- (vi) Cllr Gwen Hardman maintained that the young farmers had done an excellent job again this year.
- (vii) Members concluded - better publicity recommended for next year.

5) 01/11

Defnydd o'r iaith Gymraeg. Enquiry from Hendre resident regarding the Community Council policy on the use of the Welsh language in Council matters.

- (i) The Clerk had checked on the website for several Councils. Members agreed that the Policy used in Caerwys appeared to be suitable for using as a template.
- (ii) Two Councillors and the Clerk were identified as being able to respond to telephone calls in Welsh.
- (iii) More usage of the Welsh language to be made in the Agenda
- (iv) Clerk referred to Google Translate which appeared to be a very useful tool for translating most scripts.
- (v) Clerk had already replied to the Hendre resident.
- (vi) The Clerk presented a sample of an Agenda to the Council Meeting where more use of the Welsh language was depicted.
Cllr Tim Mitchell felt it would be better to use a dash instead of brackets between the Welsh and English headings.

6) 02/11

Dwr Cymru Welsh Water, Cronfa Ddwr Brithdir Mawr Reservoir. Information from Cllr Andrew Parkhurst regarding the proposed site visit with Dwr Cymru (Gwenan Davies) to address numerous local concerns. Item dealt with earlier.

7) 03/11

Bath Hill, Rhydymwyn, leaves build up. Report (with photos) from Cllr Gareth W Hughes forwarded to Mr Neil Hickie.

8) 04/11

DEFRA Gravel Catch Pits. Clerk reported on his conversations with Mr Michael Garrod (DEFRA) and Mr Tim Owens (NRW Hydrologist).

Mr Garrod had received approval (on 4 Nov) to instruct DEFRA's Environmental Consultant / Contractor to draw up a gravel arising management plan. The plan should take approximately six weeks to complete. The plan will identify how the gravel arising is to be dealt with.

NRW's Consent Section will then consider and hopefully approve DEFRA's plan. Position noted.

Cllr Gareth Hughes was concerned that the NRW were more concerned about depositing the stone in the correct place than protecting the villagers from potential flooding.

Cllr Hughes maintained that the catch pits had been constructed there for a reason. Whilst they are full, they are not working as intended.

- 9) 03/11 Highway matters discussed in the 21 Oct 2024 Cilcain CC meeting. Information sent to Mr Neil Hickie listing all the new items discussed in the Oct 2024 Council meeting. Position noted.
- 10) 04/11 River Alyn fallen tree obstruction near Waste Water Treatment Plant, Nant Alyn, Rhydymwyn. Report and photos from Cllr John Doyle showing the start of 'branches build up' on the top side of the obstruction caused by the fallen trees. Photos to be forwarded to Mr Peter Ellis at NRW.
- 11) 04/11 Maes Cilan semi circle, School Bus turning, Cilcain. Request sent to Mr Neil Hickie to add 'cutting back the tree' in the semi-circle to the Action List. Position noted.
- 12) 05/11 Attendance at Town / Community Council Meetings by Streetscene Supervisors. Cllr Andrew Parkhurst reported that he had been informed by the Chief Executive that the Head of Streetscene had advised that currently she cannot justify the additional hours payments for area coordinators to attend evening meetings.
- 13) 05/11 Section 137 - Discretionary Expenditure Limit for 2025-2026 - Information from the Welsh Assembly regarding the limit of donations per elector that can be made by the Community Council. The maximum expenditure that can be incurred under both section 137(1) and (3) for the financial year 2025-26 will be £11.10 per elector. Position noted.
- 14) 05/11 Sheltered Housing Review, Is Y Mynydd, Cilcain. Information from Cllr Andrew Parkhurst:
- (i) Residents who are already under 55 on the Register will remain on the Register.
 - (ii) Young persons with accessibility needs will remain on the Register.
- The point which has not been taken onboard is the issue of what is 'local'? To the Housing Officer - local means Flintshire and not the Parish.
- 15) 05/11 Rhydymwyn and Hendre Bonfire 2024. Thank you letter for the Community Council's permission and donation for 2024 bonfire. Position noted.
- 16) 06/11 Bonfire night, Cilcain, parking issues. Copy of response made by Cllr Andrew Parkhurst to Cilcain resident (AS) who had been concerned about parking obstructions in the village. Item dealt with earlier.

- 17) 07/11 Hedge Notice Bel-Air, Rhydymwyn. Copy of an email (and photos) sent to Flintshire Streetscene regarding conifer hedge overhanging the footpath link from Dolfechlas Road to the Llys Alyn housing estate. Neil will be taking the issue up with the landowner.
- 18) 08/11 Brithdir Mawr Cilcain - Update from Welsh Water regarding the proposed work to the former reservoir. Item dealt with earlier.
- 19) 11/11 Street light, Dark Sky lights at Cilcain. Reminder sent to Deeco regarding the need for wattages information. Clerk to pursue with Deeco.
- 20) 12/11 Winter Preparations 2024 /25. Information from Flintshire Streetscene. Clerk reported that this Flintshire offer has not been taken up in previous years. The report of the weather forecast being passed on to a nominated person in the community was discussed. Chair volunteered for his name to be put forward for participation in the exercise.
- 21) 12/11 CCC meeting 15/7/24 and Tactile slabs. Information from Cllr Andrew Parkhurst. Confirmation from FCC that the tactile slabs meet the required specification. Item dealt with earlier.
- 22) 12/11 Cefn Mawr Quarry. Information received by Cllr Ian Hughes regarding support of community schemes. Item dealt with earlier.
