1. CHAIRPERSON'S OPENING REMARKS

Croeso. The Chairperson welcomed Members to the June Meeting. The Chair also welcomed Cilcain resident (SJ) and Flintshire Councillor Andrew Parkhurst to the Community Council Meeting.

- **2.** <u>APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE</u> Cllr Pauline Douglas, Cllr John Doyle, Cllr Michael Parr, Cllr Christine Vaughan.
- **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST** Cllr J Emyr Davies declared an interest in the Planning application item for Tre Lan Newydd.
- **4.** MINUTES OF LAST COUNCIL MEETING Cllr Ian Hughes proposed and Cllr Gareth W Hughes seconded and all Members present agreed to approve the 19 May 2025 Minutes.

5. <u>APPOINT REPRESENTATIVES TO SERVE ON THE VARIOUS BODIES:</u>

- (i) The Chair made reference to Cllr Gwen Hardman having been nominated in her absence for several items in the May AGM meeting. Cllr Gwen Hardman confirmed acceptance of the nominations.
- (ii) The representatives for the Rhydymwyn Institute had been missed out in the May 2025 meeting. Members confirmed that there had been no change from last year.

6. MATTERS ARISING - HIGHWAY MATTERS:

The Chair reported that she had met Mr Neil Hickie after the May 2025 Council meeting. At the meeting, Mr Hickie agreed to alter the format of the Action Plan so that there would be three separate lists for:

- (A) Pot holes
- (B) Blocked gulleys
- (C) Miscellaneous.

The Chair felt that having these three sections in the Action Plan would assist in making the items run more smoothly at the Council Meeting.

The Chair referred to the email Mr Darrell Jones had sent to Cllr Andrew Parkhurst regarding the list of outstanding work. Cllr Gareth W Hughes thanked Cllr Andrew Parkhurst for raising the Council's concern about the lack of action on highway mattes. Cllr Hughes maintained that there had been a noticeable increase in the number of potholes completed last month.

7. <u>MATTES ARISING (NON HIGHWAY MATTERS)</u>

- Street Lighting, Cilcain and Rhydymwyn Clerk reported he had written to Flintshire Street Lighting Section to request a copy of an extract of Flintshire CC's schedule. No reply received as yet.
- Hendre Quarry and the Fechlas Brook Chair had sent another email to the Quarry Manager to see if the brook had been cleared. The Chair was waiting for a response.

Chair was scheduled to meet Mr Paul Reeves and Mike Wellington from Waterco on Tuesday 17 June to discuss the Hendre Flood Prevention Scheme. It appears that the Hendre Drainage Scheme has not been approved by the Welsh Government for funding this year.

Chair reported that Mr Paul Reeves was scheduled to meet a representative from Dwr Cymru about the pumping station today, 16 June 2025.

- Roadside verge fenced off, Rhydymwyn. Clerk reported that he had not yet had a response from Flintshire CC Legal Section. No change from the April Council Meeting.
- Parking concern, Cilcain Renewal of the Pedair y Groesfford Notice Boards. The Clerk reported having written to Mr Richard L Jones. Mr Jones had sent an automatic reply to indicate that he was on leave until 16 June 2025.
- p6 Sycamore Tree, Sharphaw, Dolfechlas Road, Rhydymwyn Item to stay on the Agenda.
- p6 Cilcain Reservoirs Cllr Andrew Parkhurst reported no further news since the May Council meeting.
- Cilcain defibrillator The Clerk had contacted the Clerk of Nercwys CC to find out where the 'direction information signs' seen in Nercwys had come from. No change. Clerk to pursue.
- p7 Cilcain Village Hall photovoltaic panels. Cllr Gwen Hardman reported that the solar panels had been installed and the panels were working as intended. A monitoring period would now take place to assess the actual reduction in electricity consumption.

The Chair enquired if there an update on the Shop Licence, now that the solar panels were in place? Cllr Hardman reported that the Hall Ctee Chairman had written (in February) to the Shop Chair to request a meeting to discuss the issue.

Cllr Hardman maintained that the issue was being pursued by the Hall Ctee.

The Chair maintained this item needs to stay on the Community Council's Agenda so that regular updates can be received.

- Antelope Industrial Estate, Rhydymwyn Clerk reported there had been no further contact from Flintshire CC since the April 2025 Council Meeting regarding the large building which had recently been erected at the back of Unit No 1. Clerk reported having received the photograph of the new building. The photograph was purely for the Community Council's record purposes. Reminder to be sent to Flintshire Enforcement Section.
- General flooding in Hendre, Ruby Cottages and Rhydymwyn. Chair reported there had been no change since the April 2025 Council Meeting update. The Chair reported there had been highway flooding on the Rhydymwyn side of Hendre on Friday night 13 June 2025. A blocked gulley was at fault.

p7 Rhydymwyn Flood Protection.

- (i) Clerk to pursue with Mr Hickie for the supply of a long handle rake for local volunteers to use in clearing the debris off the trash grille in storm conditions. No change since the May 2025 Council meeting. Clerk to pursue.
- (ii) In the long term, Members noted that a different style of grille may be appropriate. A photo of a recently provided grille in Mill Lane, Beaumaris had been taken by Cllr Gareth W Hughes. Cllr Tim Mitchell explained that the trash grille in Beamarris was a self cleaning grille, which would automatically lift an obstructing log from the grille front.
- (iii) Automatic lifting trash grille down river of the Defra road bridge.
 Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported that the lifting mechanism was broken again.
 Cllr Hughes got the impression that the mechanism was tripping out when the two gates were being lifted at the same time, probably due to overloading. A higher powered motor mechanism was being fitted on Monday 16 June 2026.
 - Cllr Tim Mitchell reported that there are a number of dead trees in the river that will be washed down in the next big storm. Members agreed that a tree catcher, well up river of the grille, would be an effective way of dealing with logs and branches in storm conditions. It might be appropriate to ask NRW if any more thought has been given to introducing a tree catcher near The Graig pull-in in Nant Alyn Road.
- (iv) A spare key recently provided by Mr Neil Hickie for the Donkey Field was being passed on from Cllr Gareth W Hughes to Cllr John Doyle.
- p7 Defra bridge pillar, Rhydymwyn Clerk to enquire with Flintshire's Bridge Engineer if all the work to the pillars has been completed.
- Vehicular speed results, Hendre. The Chair reported there had been no change in the position since last month. Cllr Gareth W Hughes reported having seen an item in the press on the 16 June giving a full list of road sections which were scheduled to be changed back from 20 mph. The list included Hendre, but the press article did indicate that a final decision had not yet been taken.

p7 Funding from Welsh Assembly for pot hole repairs - No change from the May meeting. Kate Wilby had agreed to prepare a report. **p**7 Cilcain Chapel, drain at side and rear of the Chapel. Flintshire CC had requested access to any legal documents that the Chapel had. A copy of the TV survey, arranged by The Chapel, had been passed on to Cllr Andrew Parkhurst. Cllr Parkhurst reported that the survey information had been passed on to Mr Paul Reeves. Mr Reeves was making enquiries with the Council's Legal Section. **p8** Dwr Cymru Reservoir at Cilcain Pump House -Cllr Parkhurst had inspected the new fence and noticed a gap between the new fence and the Pump House building. Dwr Cymru had been requested to close the gap and erect some signs on the new fence. Fechlas Brook debris not cleared. The Chair had emailed Mr Frazer Harding but a reply p8 had not been received. No change since the April Council Meeting. Bryngwiog Lead Mine disaster (1862) - Cllr Gwen Hardman reported on the recent p8 discussion with the local resident (MB) who had raised the issue. The local resident was going to collect the historical information together and display the information collected in Cilcain Church. Play Areas Match-Funding Scheme 2025/26. Clerk to arrange a site meeting with Mr p8 Richard Roberts to discuss the scheme details. Clerk to enquire with Peter Ellis if the camera unit near the Defra Bridge can be p8 switched off in good weather by remote control (Wi-Fi). The land owner did not favour a solar powered camera. Overhanging hedge obstructing footway and replacing of fence required near **p8** Rhosesmor Junction. Item needs to be added to the Action Plan. Cilcain Play Area, damage to timber boundary wall supporting the border planting area p8 Item reported to Mr Richard Roberts. Site meeting discussed earlier. p9 Pond by former Cilcain Water Treatment Works - Item discussed earlier. p10 Cilcain Village Hall, cover for voltaic panels on the Village Hall. Clerk to enquire with Zurich if they would need to add the panels to the existing policy, consequently increasing the Council's building premium. p10 The Waen Cilcain - Members agreed for the Clerk to contact the Cilcain Show Ctee to request that the goal post be replaced if it is necessary to take it out for the Cilcain Show event. Road closure Rhydymwyn and Cilcain. Cllr Parkhurst reported that Neil Hickie had p10 met Cllr Parr in a site visit on 12 June AM. A circular depression was spotted near the

Bottom Road Junction with Pantymwyn Road. Road closure notices were erected

and a temporary repair carried out. The signs were not taken down immediately and this caused some confusion.

- Cilcain Village Hall. Request for permission for proposed internal refurbishment work. The Council's permission had been sent. Cllr Ian Hughes had met Members of the Hall Ctee to discuss the building aspects of the proposed work. Cllr Gwen Hardman requested that the Council Minutes notes the Village Hall Committee's thanks to Cllr Ian Hughes for his useful suggestions / input into the refurbishment application. Grant Application now applied for Approx amount £14,000.
- Gwysaney Arms Hotel. Cllr Andrew Parkhurst reported that there had not been any change in the position since the May Council Meeting.
- P11 Road speed outside Ysgol y Foel, Cilcain Cllr Andrew Parkhurst reported that the speed strips had been down for one week and then removed. No results received as yet.

8.0 <u>NEIL'S ACTION LIST</u>

(A) Pot hole Section - Page 1

Item 2 Coed Du Rhydymwyn. Cllr Gareth W Hughes maintained it was not clear what Item 2 referred to.

The Chair had spoken to Neil Hickie regarding the confusion that often occurs between the location names that Neil knows and the location names referred to by Members. However, the names on the Action List would need to refer to the location names that Neil would issue to the repair workforce.

Cllr Malcolm Down reported on this location confusion being discussed at the recent site meeting with Neil. Unfortunately, no firm position / agreement had been arrived at in the site meeting.

Cllr Hughes maintained that locations of potholes used to be sprayed at one time.

Item 4 Pentre, Cilcain - Cllr J V Worthington commented that the title 'The Pentre, Cilcain' could refer to several different sections of road. Clarification would be useful to indicate which road in the Pentre was being referred to in the Action Plan.

Item 7 The Chair did not recognise the location 'Pothole to Air Grid'.

(B) <u>Gulley Section</u>

Item 2 - Not done

Item 4 Cllr Ian Hughes referred to the Date Received being 23/04/25. This item had been raised more than ten years ago.

Cllr J Emyr Davies noted that painting the white lines needed to be included on the Action Plan. The Chair referred to the white lines issue being mentioned in a recent email from Mr Darrel Jones to Cllr Andrew Parkhurst.

Cllr Andrew Parkhurst maintained it should not be up to the Members to chase each individual item. Neil should be checking on the items and reporting the position of each item in the next Action List.

The Chair maintained that dealing with the Action Plan was confusing and to avoid further frustration, felt it appropriate to skip the Miscellaneous Section, and concentrate instead on new items to the added to the Action Plan.

(C) <u>Items to be added to the Action Plan</u>

- (a) White lines to be added.
- (b) Boundary between Flintshire and Denbishire, Loggerheads Road, Cilcain
- (c) Nant Alyn Road, Rhydymwyn. Fresh pot hole 20 yds on the Village side of the trench depression (the 'trench depression' being 80yds from the Coed Du Hall junction).
- (d) Plas Uchaf to the Pistyll, Cilcain
- (e) From Pedair y Groesffordd to Plas Newydd and beyond potholes everywhere.
- (f) Centre of the village in Cilcain small pot holes everywhere each side of The Square
- (g) Pothole / depression in Pantymwyn Road outside 'Allt y Grug' opposite the Is y Mynydd estate.
- (h) Opposite the Antelope, Rhydymwyn overgrowing hedge obstructing the highway footway.

09. PLANNING MATTERS -

(i) Ref No: FUL/000296/25

Proposal: Installation of a 20kw solar PV installation to reduce the carbon

footprint of the glamping business and lower business costs over the longer term. The paddock is currently grazed by sheep and will

continue to be grazed once the installation is completed.

Location: Trelan Newydd, Cilcain, Mold, CH7 5N

The Community Council has **no objection** to the development.

Proposal: Proposed change of use of part of the land adj. to the service station,

and rationalisation of existing parking provisions to provide additional

car parking facilities

Location: Land adj. Rhydymwyn Service Station, Rhydymwyn, Mold, CH7 5HE

The Community Council has **no objection** to the development, subject to the following:

(a) The visibility arrangement being to the satisfaction of Flintshire CC's Highway Section

(b) The applicant being able to satisfy NRW's requirements regarding the effect of the development on the flood plain.

10. <u>CORRESPONDENCE</u>

1) 20/05 Waen goalpost refitted. Information from Cllr J V Worthington. Position noted.

2) 20/05 Agenda Stakeholder Meeting 20th May 2025. Chair reported at the Council meeting. Fifteen stakeholder groups were invited and thirteen groups attended.

- (i) Members noted that an invitation to attend had been sent to the former Flintshire County Councillor. Clerk to contact Michael Garrod to provide him with the details for Cllr Andrew Parkhurst.
- (ii) Cllr Gareth W Hughes enquired if handing over the site to the land Trust had been discussed. Issue had not been discussed.
- (iii) Cllr J V Worthington had met Becky Gittins in one of the local agricultural events. Becky appeared to be fairly enthusiastic about the Land Trust possible involvement.
- (iv) The Clerk reported having discussed the Land Trust issue recently with Michael Garrod. The Councils likely concern would be: who would pay if major new issues were to occur, such as:
 - (a) The need to replace the entrance grille with a more reliable design.
 - (b) Unforeseen erosion and repair issues with the culverted watercourse.
 - (c) Unforeseen contamination exposed or discovered.

Mr Garrod had indicated the unforeseen issues would have to be excluded from any potential maintenance transfer agreement.

Members noted that recently the Member of Parliament has been able to assist the Community Council in imposing pressure on DEFRA to undertake works. Since the Land Trust is not answerable to any democratic body, the Community Council would lose the ability to impose pressure via the MP.

- 3) 20/05 Waste Collection Copy of email sent by the Chair to Flintshire Waste Collection Service. Response to her correspondence had not yet been received. Numerous representations had also been made to Flintshire CC by Cllr Andrew Parkhurst and local residents. However, Chair reported that on 16 June 2025 the proper collection made by Flintshire CC had been made, after 8 weeks of disruption.
- 4) 21/05 Fence completed, Pentre, Cilcain. Note received from Cllr J V Worthington. Dwr Cymru's fence completed but no warning signs on the fence. Cllr Gareth W Hughes enquired about the fence by Glan Aber, Pentre. Cllr Worthington noted that the fence by Glan Aber was on Neil's Action Plan. (Item 7 on the miscellaneous page).
- 5) 21/05 Community Review. Information from Flintshire CC regarding the Community Boundary review that had to be postponed by Flintshire CC in 2023.
- 6) 23/05 (i) Rhydymwyn. The ash die-back tree Donkey Field Rhydymwyn Report received from Cllr Gareth W Hughes regarding an ash die back tree on the left hand side of pedestrian access in Dolfechlas Rd. Item reported to Mr Richard Roberts at Flintshire Leisure and Dewi Ellis (Flintshire CC). Dewi has subsequently inspected the tree, and is arranging for three ash trees to be removed by the end of July 2025.
 - (ii) Cilcain. The two trees in the boundary hedge near the route of the public footpath are not an imminent safety threat. Flintshire will monitor these two trees.

However, a tree in the boundary hedge of the play area is in need of attention. Photo included in the correspondence issued to Members. Cllr J V Worthington, Cllr Gwen Hardman and the Clerk had met Mr Dewi Ellis on site on the 16 June 2025 to discuss the tree threatening the play area. The tree subject to ash-dieback was judged to be in the original boundary between the Chapel and Waen Field.

- 7) 22/05 Meeting between the Chair and Mr Hickie regarding the Action plan Chair reported at the Council meeting.
- 8) 23/05 Blocked gulley grids on the A541 near Lloyds Terrace in Hendre. Information from Neil Hickie. Gulley grid now cleared.
- 9) 24/05 Defra site Rhydymwyn. Gravel Management Plan. Information from Cllr John Doyle. Position noted.
- Dogs on the Waen Email from a Cilcain resident (DF) regarding the Waen Field, Cilcain. Chair reported on a site meeting she had recently made. The Chair thanked Cllr Ian Hughes for clearing the vegetation around the existing entrance sign. Members appreciated that the sign merely requests dog owners, 'in the interest of public health and hygiene and the children and others using the field' to keep their dogs from the field.

The Chair explained that within two or three minutes, two dog owners were exercising their dogs. Both dog owners, as soon as they noticed that a meeting was taking place, picked up the dog fouling and the dogs were put back on a lead.

The 'play area' is covered by a public protection order, and dogs are not allowed to enter. However, the field is currently not covered by an order. Cilcain bowing green and the Cilcain cemetery are currently covered by an official Public Protection Order.

Cllr J Emyr Davies maintained that the position in the Waen Field has improved recently, since the entrance sign has been cleared.

However, Cllr Davies expressed his concern regarding the danger that exists with dogs, especially when they are not on a lead. He had recently witnessed a dog owner struggling to keep a large dog under control, even when the dog was on a lead. The mothers with toddlers sitting around a picnic table were in a state of panic. The mothers were lifting their toddlers above their heads and screaming in fright.

Cllr Gwen Hardman explained that The Waen has a 'village green' status, but many villagers are not aware of the village green status. Signs designed by local school children at both ends of the footpath might be appropriate.

Clerk to arrange for Cilcain Members to meet Flintshire CC's Dog Officer to seek his advice on how to control or prohibit dog fouling on the Waen.

Regarding the condition of the grass cutting, Cllr Davies and Cllr Ian Hughes had recently inspected the condition of the playing area and were completely satisfied with grass cutting regime provided by Flintshire CC.

The Cilcain resident who wanted to make suggestions how the field could be better used was to be offered the opportunity to make a 3 minute presentation at the start of the next Council meeting.

- 11) 28/05 Ash tree in the Cilcain play area boundary hedge Photo from Cllr J V Worthington showing the location of the ash tree in relation to the play area. Position noted.
- 12) 31/05 Request for letter of support Rhydymwyn War Memorial Institute Improvements. Position noted.

Cllr Hardman reported that the Hall Committee had submitted a grant application to Cadwyn Clwyd for modifications to the entrance hall and toilet. 17) 03/06 Nannerch and Cilcain Action Plans. Copy of correspondence between Cllr Andrew Parkhurst and Mr Darrell Jones (Flintshire CC) regarding the Action Plans. Item discussed earlier. 18) 04/06 FCC Flintshire Community Chest Fund - Round 1 Information from Vanessa Owens (One Voice Wales Support Officer). The Chair reported that a number of local organisations had made a note of the information. 19) 04/06 Spar Quarry, Cilcain. Copy of email from Cefn Road resident to Hannah Parish at Flintshire CC.
